Memorial Hall Feasibility Study

A feasibility study on the future for the Harden Memorial Hall was presented to the Council earlier this year. The conclusion of the study said:

There is little prospect of increasing or diversifying usage of the Memorial Hall, and therefore no obvious gains to be achieved from local management of the facility. The two main users have indicated that they could

only consider asset transfer if they had access to all relevant financial details as well as information about the structure and current condition of the building. The parish council could formally approach the main users of the building, disclosing all details they now hold, with a view to

developing proposals to put to Bradford Council.'

A meeting took place in November between the users of the hall, officers from Bradford Council and members of the Parish Council about the contents of the report and a further discussion is planned. It is clear that Bradford has no money to maintain the building although it is their responsibility and the hall is losing £15,000 a year.

There are no easy answers to this one but the Parish Council will work with the users to try to find a way forward.

There has been a lot of concern recently about the future of the Post Office. It was closed for a time but has now re-opened with relief staff.

When the Parish Council conducted a survey in 2008 to save the Post Office from possible closure the response was overwhelming.
