Speeding and Traffic

he Village Council is continuing to discuss with Bradford Council options for tackling speeding in Harden, and making our village a safer, more pleasant place to be.

We are looking at a potential 20 mph scheme, incorporating gateways, to slow vehicles down ZONE as they enter the village, and other measures to make clear to drivers that this is a place for people. We are also looking into a potential community speed watch, and improvements to make it easier and safer for people to walk and cycle.

If you have any comments, please get in touch, and if you're a driver, please do make sure you're staying well under the limit, or consider whether walking, cycling or the bus could be an alternative for at least some journeys.

£10,000 for **Green Travel Project**

■ arden Village Council recently led a bid to I the Shipley Climate Action Fund, in collaboration with Wilsden Parish Council, Cullingworth Village Council, Denholme Town Council, Bingley Town Council, Sustrans and Mapping for Change.

The Shipley Area Committee have just announced the bid has been successful and have made an award of £10,000.

The project will seek to develop local awareness and enthusiasm towards climate-safe, green and healthy travel modes - walking, cycling, public transport and community transport.

We want to deliver benefits across the five local councils around traffic and transport and providing evidence, recommendations and materials that can be used on a long-term basis, as well as enhancing relations with community groups.

The lengths we go to.....

We have recently partnered with Bradford Council to support an operative to undertake additional

environmental and cleaning improvement work in the village for 10 hours a week. Activity will include cutting back overgrowing vegetation, sign cleaning, litter picking and other work to maintain



and enhance the village. The operative is employed as a Lengthsman, a term coined in the 1700s to refer to someone who kept a "length" of road neat, tidy and passable.
