Bingley Rural Green Travel Project

Our Bingley Rural Green Travel Project, looking at how we can make greater use of public transport, walking and cycling for local journeys, has come to a close, but work is continuing to draw on the information collected.

Run by the local councils of Harden, Cullingworth, Denholme and Wilsden, it involved local engagement, promotions and listening exercises, getting people thinking and talking about how we can get around more sustainably.

We gathered lots of useful input, including on how bus services can be more joined-up, and making our streets safer for walking and cycling. We've been relaying this to Bradford Council, West Yorkshire Combined Authority, Keighley Bus Company and First Bus, through a series of positive meetings, and we'll keep working towards improvements.

Traffic noise spoils Remembrance Service

After the Remembrance Service last year was made almost inaudible because of traffic noise, the Village Council decided to see if the roads around the Memorial could be closed off during the service.



After much form filling and debate with Bradford Council it has

proved unacceptable to close Long Lane, Keighley Road and Harden Road for the whole service because there is no practical diversion for traffic.

However, Wilsden Road will be closed from 1045 - 1115 and traffic will be stopped during the one minute silence on Long Lane and Harden Road by council staff with lollipop 'Stop/Go' signs.

Play in the Park



During the school summer holiday the Village Council paid for Play in the Park events to be held in the Memorial Park at a cost of £3,600.

All six events were well-attended. The Village Council would welcome feedback from users when it considers whether to organise the event again at a slightly increased cost in 2023.
